

CURRENT INCOME ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS

These are the income standards that are used to determine eligibility and calculate the family share for Child Care Services effective October 1, 2023—May 31, 2024.

The Day Care family share is based on the amount of the family's income that exceeds the current Income Eligibility Standard. There is one basic family share for a family regardless of the number of children receiving day care services. The parent must pay the family share directly to the provider.

FORMULA USED TO DETERMINE FEE:

Annual Gross Income minus (-) State Income Standard times (x) 1% = Weekly Fee \div 52 (weeks) Low Income cases will pay a fee of at least \$1.00 per week, Transitional Day Care, payee cases and homeless clients have no family share
